

Energy regulator reports meeting all data security requirements to implement REMIT systems

Romania's National Energy Regulatory Authority (ANRE) has met all the requirements set by the Agency for the Co-operation of Energy Regulators (ACER) for the implementation of data security systems required under Regulation (EU) No. 1227/2011 on Wholesale Energy Market Integrity and Transparency (REMIT).

According to an ANRE press statement released on Tuesday, an audit board composed of representatives of ACER and representatives of other regulatory authorities validated the compliance of ANRE's security policies with the ACER requirements for REMIT data security and integrity.

Following the successful completion of the audit process, ANRE will receive access to ACER systems and will be able to analyse or use in its investigations data collected by ACER. The aim is to increase the transparency and stability of European energy markets and to combat market manipulation, to the benefit of the final user.

Winning access to REMIT data means intensifying collaboration especially in the monitoring of the energy and natural gas markets with other regulators of other European Union states, such as Germany, France, Lithuania, Belgium, the Netherlands, Italy, Austria, Hungary, Slovenia, the UK, Denmark, Finland, Sweden, which have been audited and are meeting the security requirements.
