

IMF delegation to virtually to assess the Romanian economy starting Monday

A team of the International Monetary Fund (IMF), led by the head of the IMF mission for Romania, Jan Kees Martijn, will virtually visit Bucharest, between May 10 and 28, for the annual analysis of the Romanian economy, known under the name of the Article IV Consultation.

"The IMF team will discuss with the Romanian authorities about economic policies and developments. Virtual meetings will be held with officials from the Ministry of Finance, the National Bank of Romania, other government agencies, as well as representatives of business milieu and NGOs," reads a release from the financial institution sent to AGERPRES.

At the end of the virtual visit, the mission will present the conclusions of the visit.

Jan Kees Martijn is a Dutch citizen and is currently Head of Mission for Romania and Serbia, Head of the South-East Division of the European Department and until recently was Head of Mission for Albania. Prior to joining the IMF, Jan Kees Martijn was a professor of international economics at the University of Amsterdam and holds a doctorate in economics.

Currently, Romania does not have an ongoing financing agreement with the International Monetary Fund, but the financial institution annually evaluates the evolution of the Romanian economy, based on the consultations on Article IV.
