

## PM Citu: I've disbanded SIIJ, now it is Parliament's role to come with best solution

**Prime Minister Florin Citu declared on Tuesday that the Section for Investigating Crimes in Justice (SIIJ) has been disbanded through the draft law approved by Government, and now "it is the role of the Parliament, under the guidance of the Ministry of Justice, to come up with the best solution," specifying that talks on this matter will be resumed next week.**

"From my point of view it is all very simple: I disbanded SIIJ, being a draft law approved by Government. Now it is the Parliament's role, under the guidance of the Ministry of Justice, to come up with the best solution, if there is a better solution than what we did in the Government sitting and I await the Parliament's solutions, along with the Ministry of Justice. Regarding what concerns me and the Government, we came up with a solution through which we disbanded the Special Section. UDMR (Hungarian Democratic Union of Romania), USR (Save Romania Union) have a different point of view, I believe that we can find a common element here, which is why I requested yesterday's reunion (of the governing coalition, ed. n) to be suspended, to delay it and to return after the experts will meet," Florin Citu said, at Victoria Palace.

He specified that there will be new talks on this subject next week.

"I say we need to go back to the experts, there is a work group, that's where the best opinions should come from. (...) UDMR is also there, as well as PNL (National Liberal Party) and USR. After that we will return next week, I am sure that we will find the best solutions. We need to come up with the best solutions and we will resume talks next week. The coalition is not breaking, the coalition keeps moving forward and is strong," Citu highlighted.
