

Beneficiaries of international protection may receive residence permits, travel documents at residence address

The government has amended and supplemented methodological rules for the application of Law 102 of 2006 on asylum in Romania, approved by Government Decision 1251/2006, thus regulating the possibility for the beneficiaries of international protection (BIP) to be able to receive at a residence address their residence permits and travel documents against a shipping fee.

The government decision was approved at a government meeting on Wednesday.

"Also, the lump sums granted as material assistance for BIPs to rent a house were updated to 808 lei/person/month, and the amounts granted as material assistance for covering housing expenses were updated to 145 lei/month/person in summertime and 185 lei/month/person for in wintertime. The mentioned amounts can be granted on a nominal bank card, under public procurement contracts and/or framework agreements that the General Immigration Inspectorate is to conclude at the national or local level," according to a government press statement released on Thursday.
